# *We've Only Just Begun*

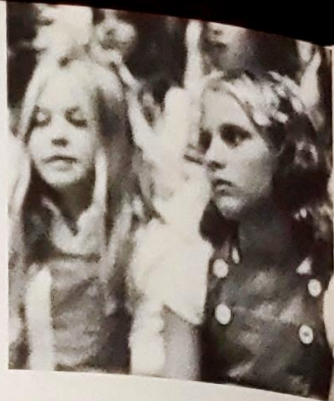
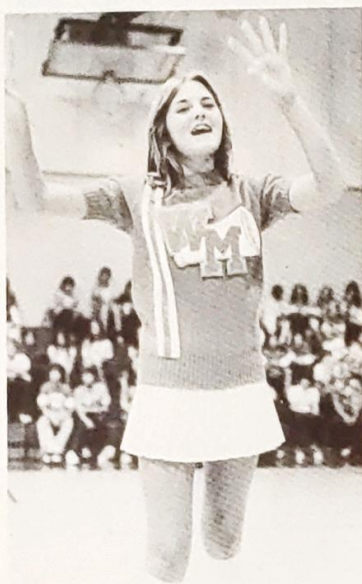

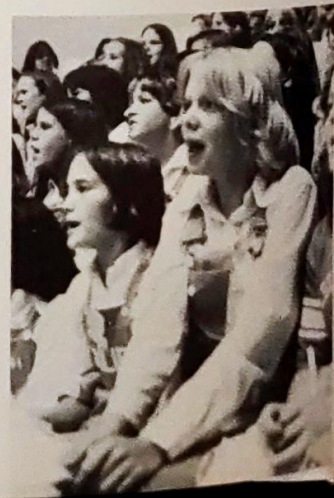

# Top of the World



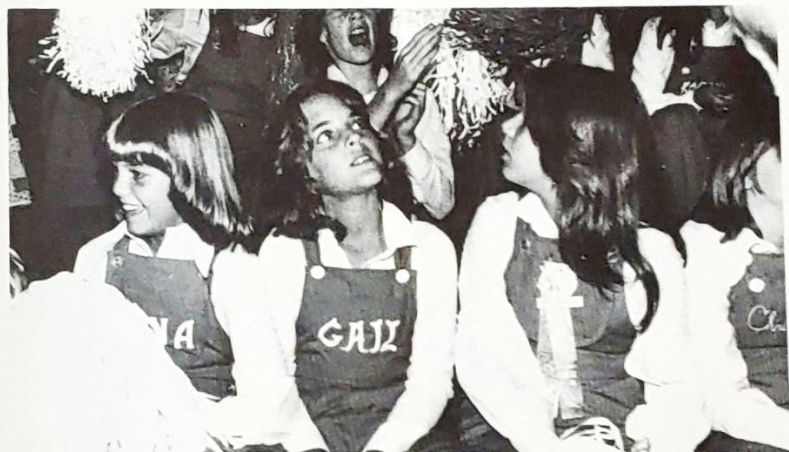

I wish for each of you further success and happiness as you continue your education in preparation for your life's work.

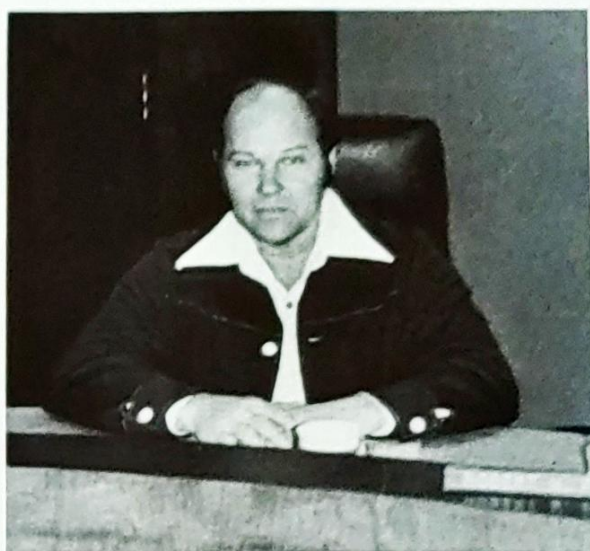

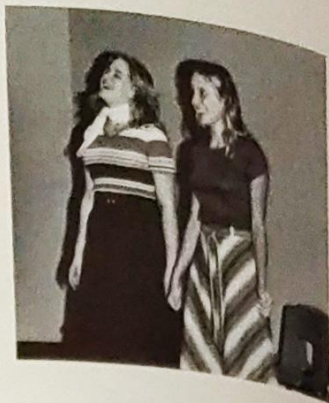
# Yesterday When I Was Young

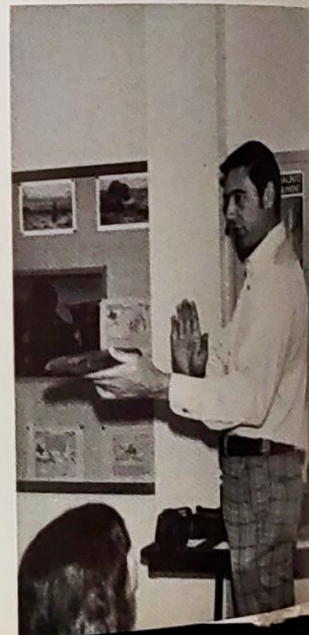

# Teacher I Need You

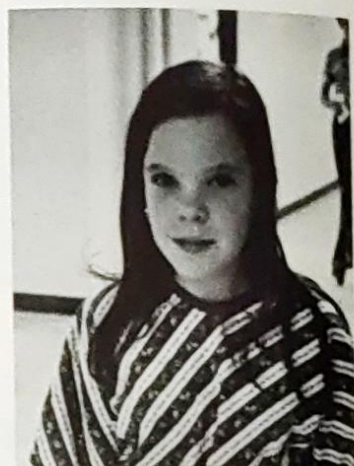

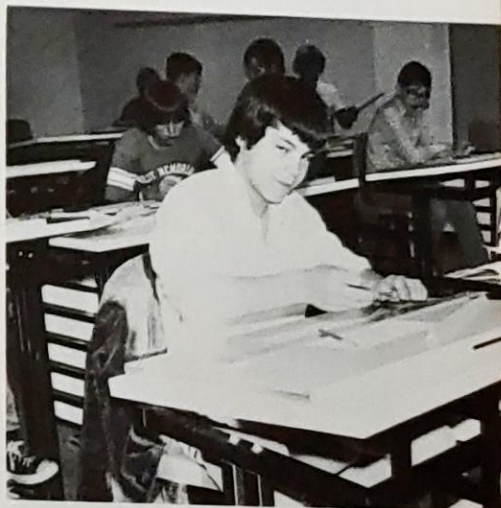
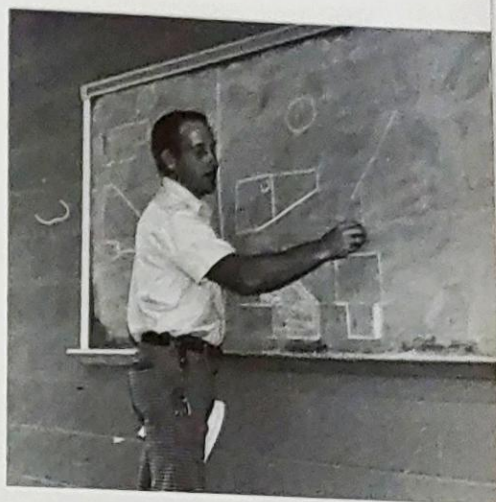
The Homemaking students explored topics such as grooming, friendships, family relations, babysitting, and room planning.

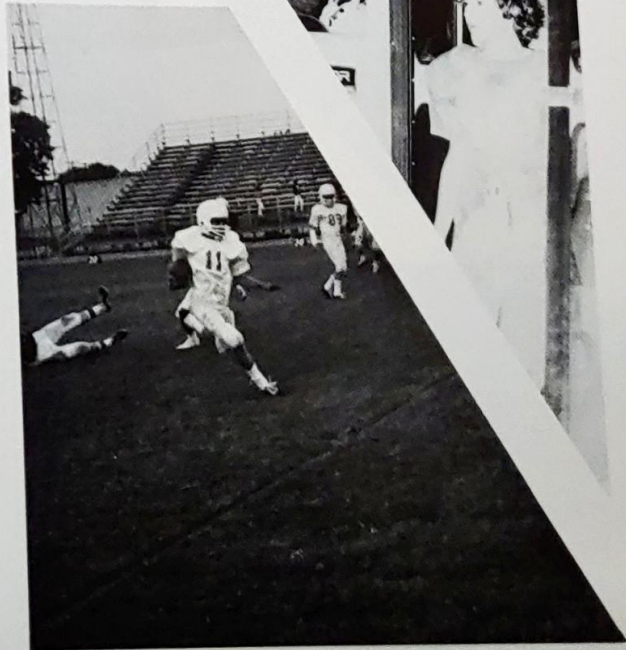
